Title of Sermon: Therefore God is For Us

Passage: Romans 8:31-39 NIV

Intro -

1. What was the best news you have ever received? What is the story behind how you received it? Why was it such good news?
2. Do you think that a Christian can lose his or her salvation? Why or why not?

Sermon Points -

1. Read through Romans 8:1-30.
 - a. What kinds of things stick out to you?
 - b. As a Christian, how do you feel after reading this passage?
 - c. What kind of responses do you have to what you have read?
2. Why is the word “glorified” in Romans 8:30 in the past tense? Why is this important?
3. What do you think “all things” refers to in Romans 8:32? Please give evidence of your answer by looking at the context of the passage.
4. For what reasons do we often feel condemned?
 - a. How do others act to condemn us?
 - b. How does Satan try to condemn us? Why is he often successful in making us feel that way?
 - c. How does Romans 8:33-34 help us to respond properly to accusations of condemnation?
5. Do you think most of us are surprised by the presence of suffering in our lives? If so, why are we that way? What factors in our lives make us feel like life should be largely free from suffering? Is this the way people in other parts of the world see it? Why or why not?
6. Read Romans 8:37-39. In light of what this passage teaches, revisit your answer to the question at the beginning. Do you think you can lose your salvation? Why or why not?
7. In what ways does this passage influence your boldness in following Jesus?
